Women's Sewing Projects in Rwanda & Uganda



In Rwanda and Uganda we have worked to provide women the opportunity to break the unfortunate cycle of poverty in their communities through sewing. Students receive a free yearlong training, for which they receive certification that enables them to start sewing for others or start their own business with our micro loans. We provide the sewing machines, fabric and all the necessary tools for them to start learning.

This project is especially important to us because most girls never complete secondary school, often having to drop out to work in the fields until they wed early and start their own families. This project helps teach women a skill that can help provide for themselves and their family. Additionally, this skill can lead to a career that can prevent poaching of the forest wildlife.



Pictured to the left is one of our masks are made in Uganda by the Sewing Center team. The masks help protect you and the people around you. They also help save endangered wildlife because every donation dollar goes back to help wildlife in danger of becoming extinct. The fabric will not bleed color and they are washable and reusable. 
This video below shows a student leader, Mandla, as he continues his education to protect Wildlife in Africa.
